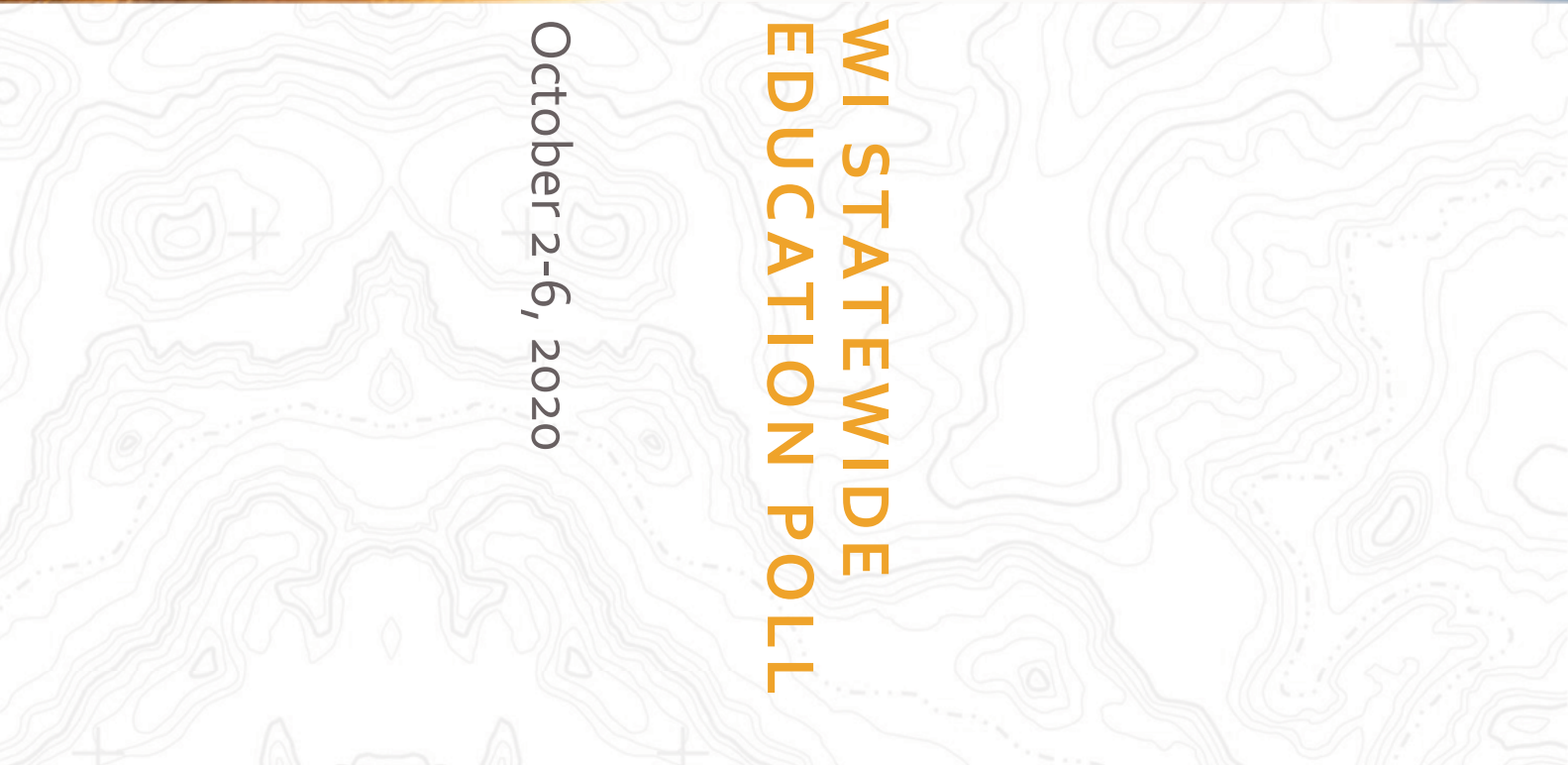




WI STATEWIDE EDUCATION POLL

The following survey was conducted by OnMessage Inc in Wisconsin. Telephone interviews were conducted on October 2-6, 2020. This survey consists of 800 likely general election voters and was stratified to reflect historic voter trends. The margin of error for this survey is +/- 3.46%.

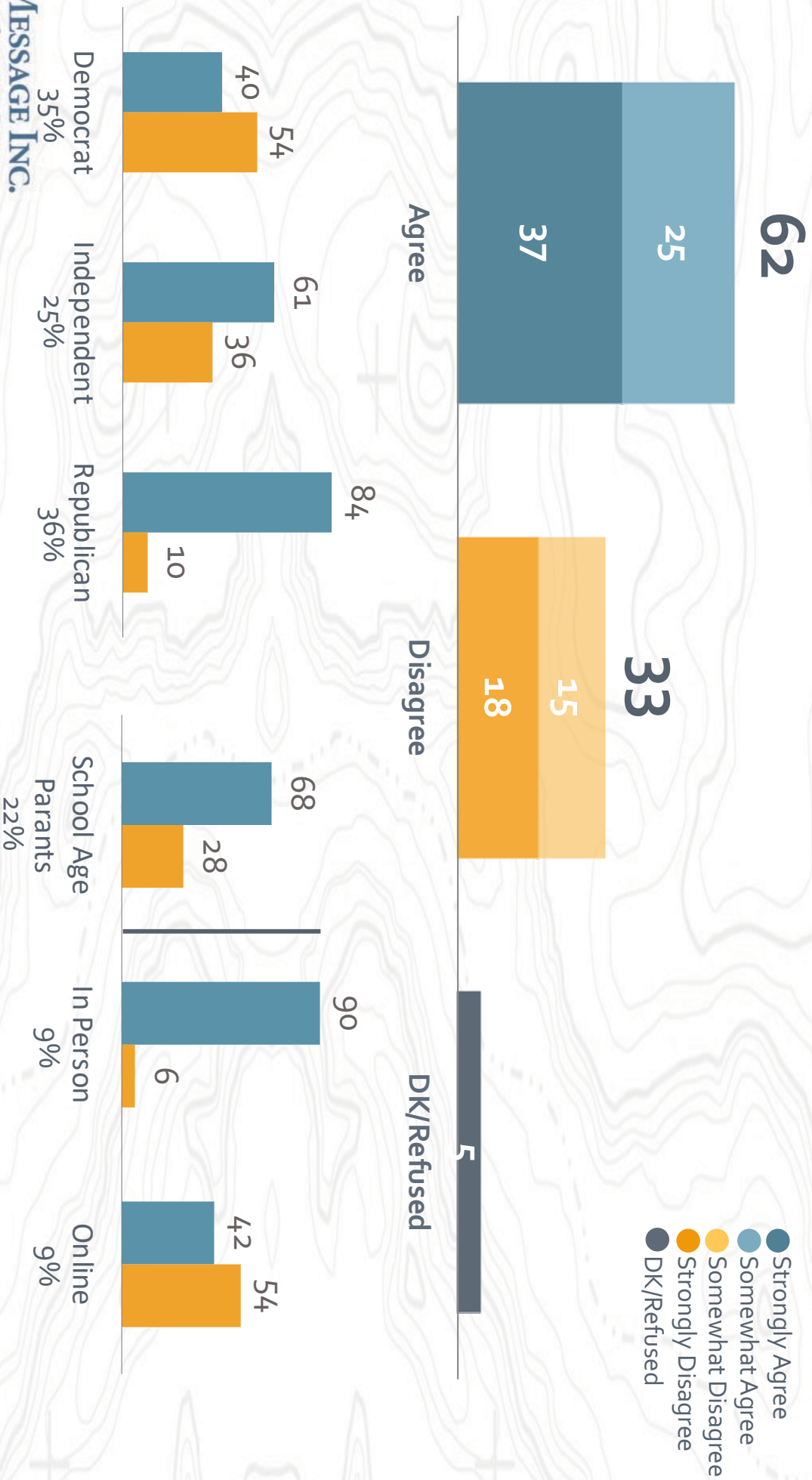

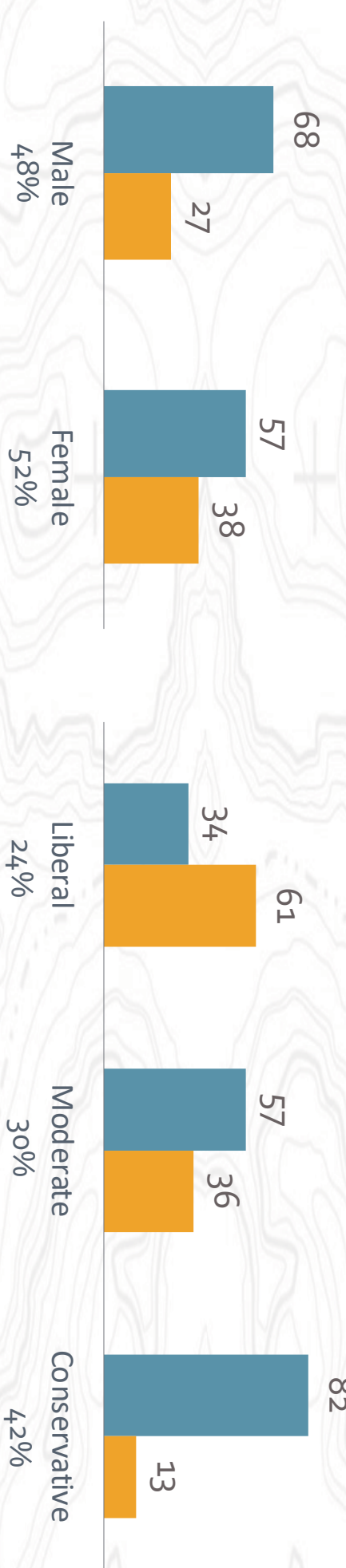
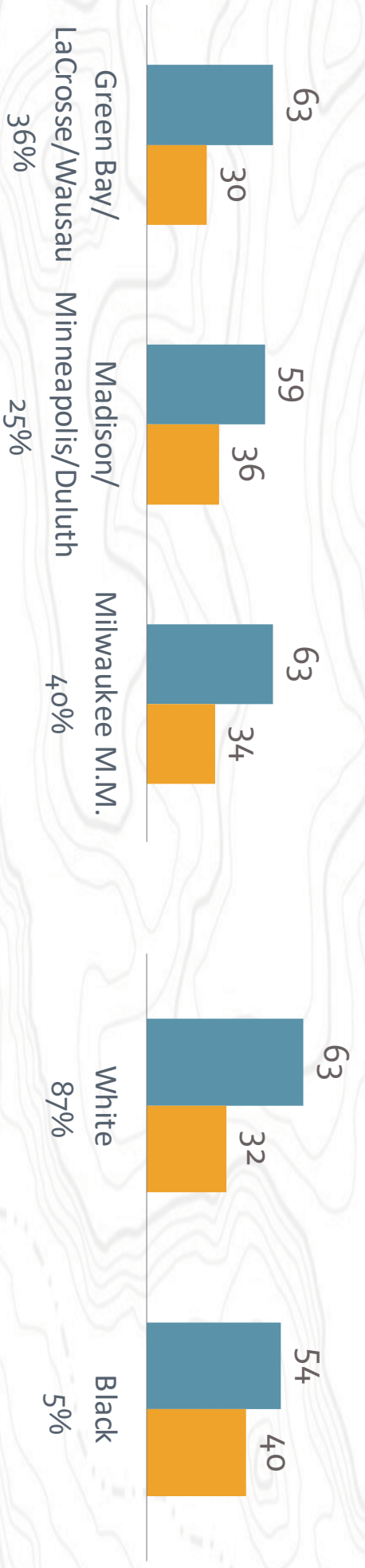

Please tell me if you agree or disagree with the following statement. I believe Public schools should now offer in-person instruction as one of the options available for families.



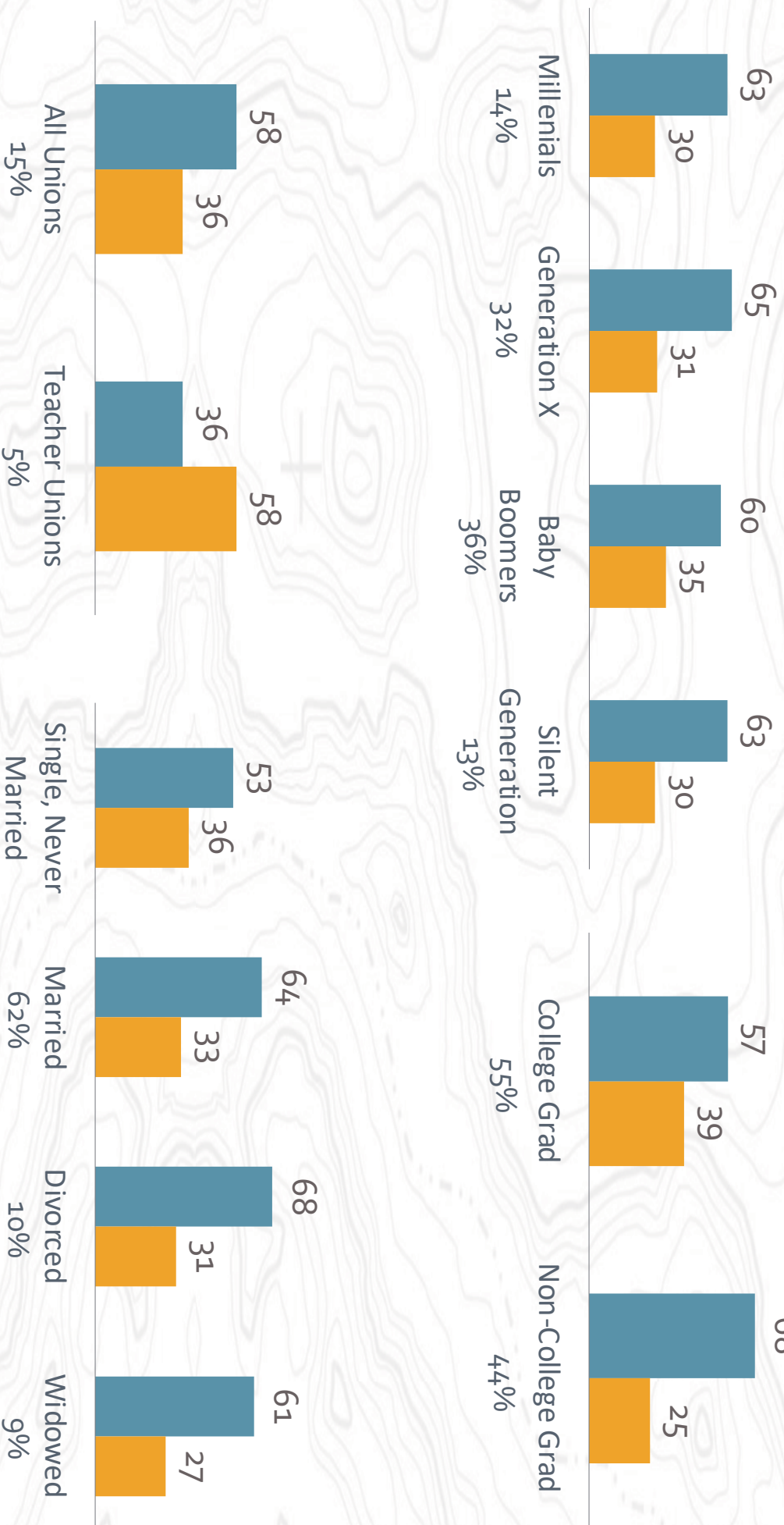

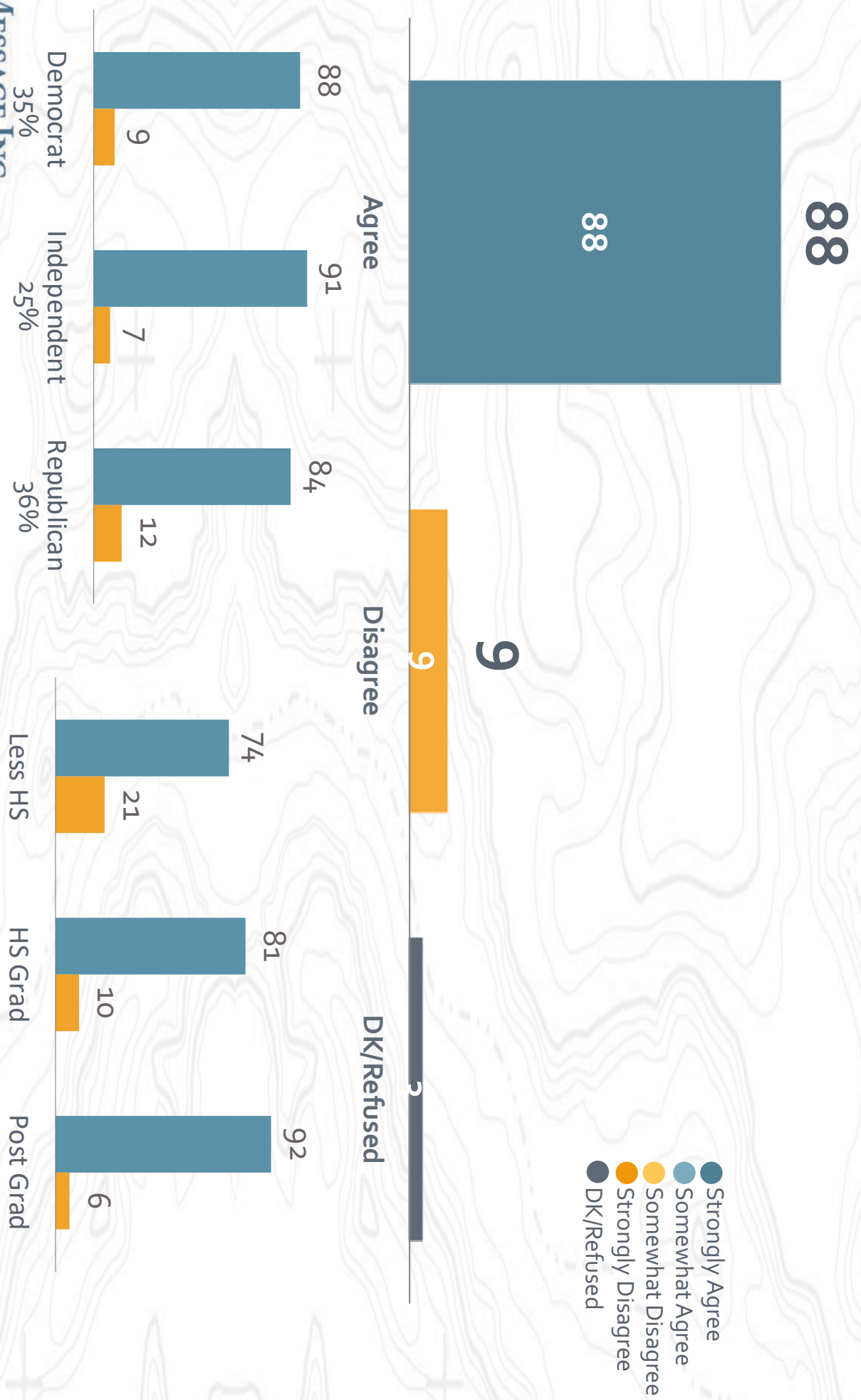

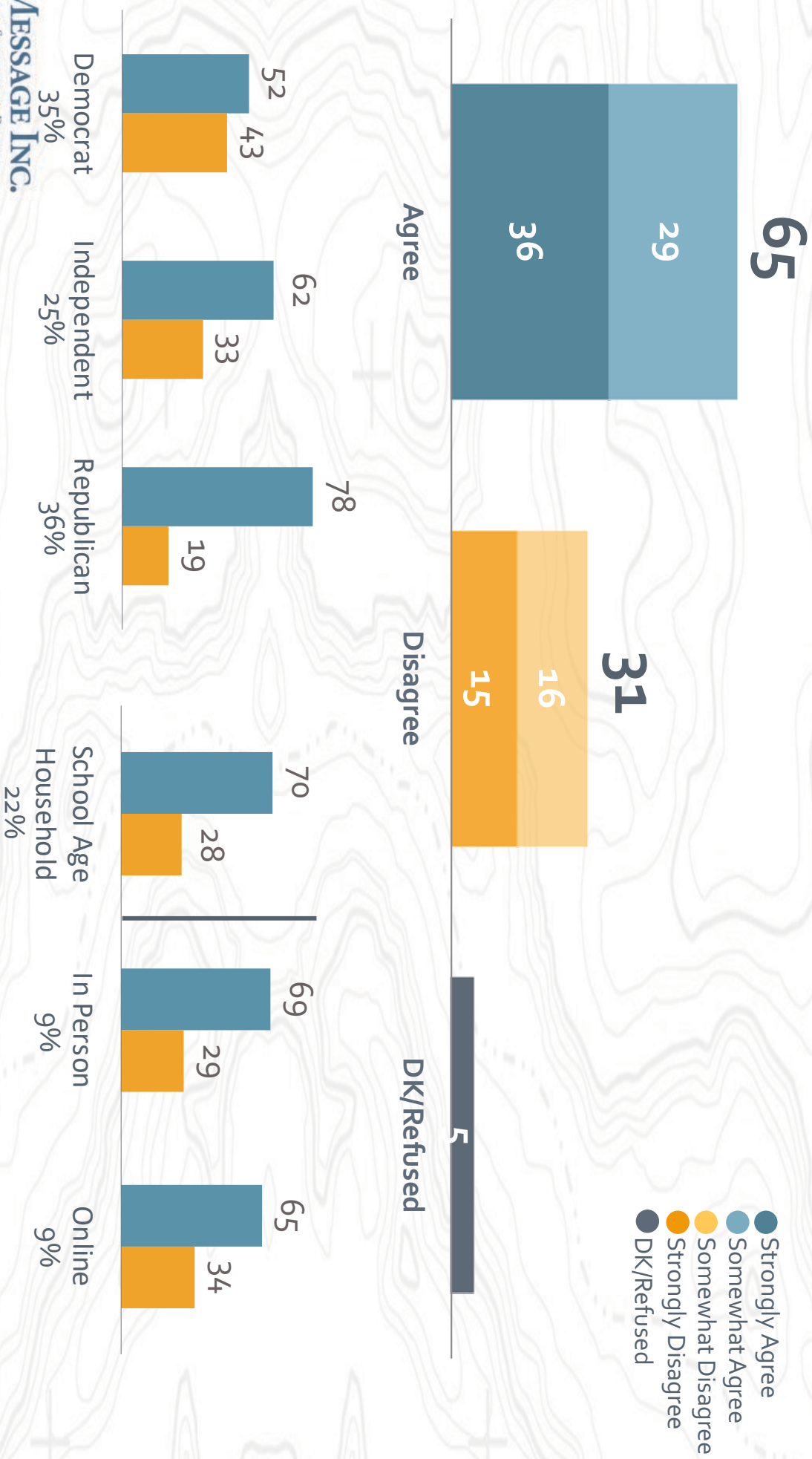
TEACHERS AS ESSENTIAL WORKERS

Do you consider teachers to be essential workers during COVID 19?

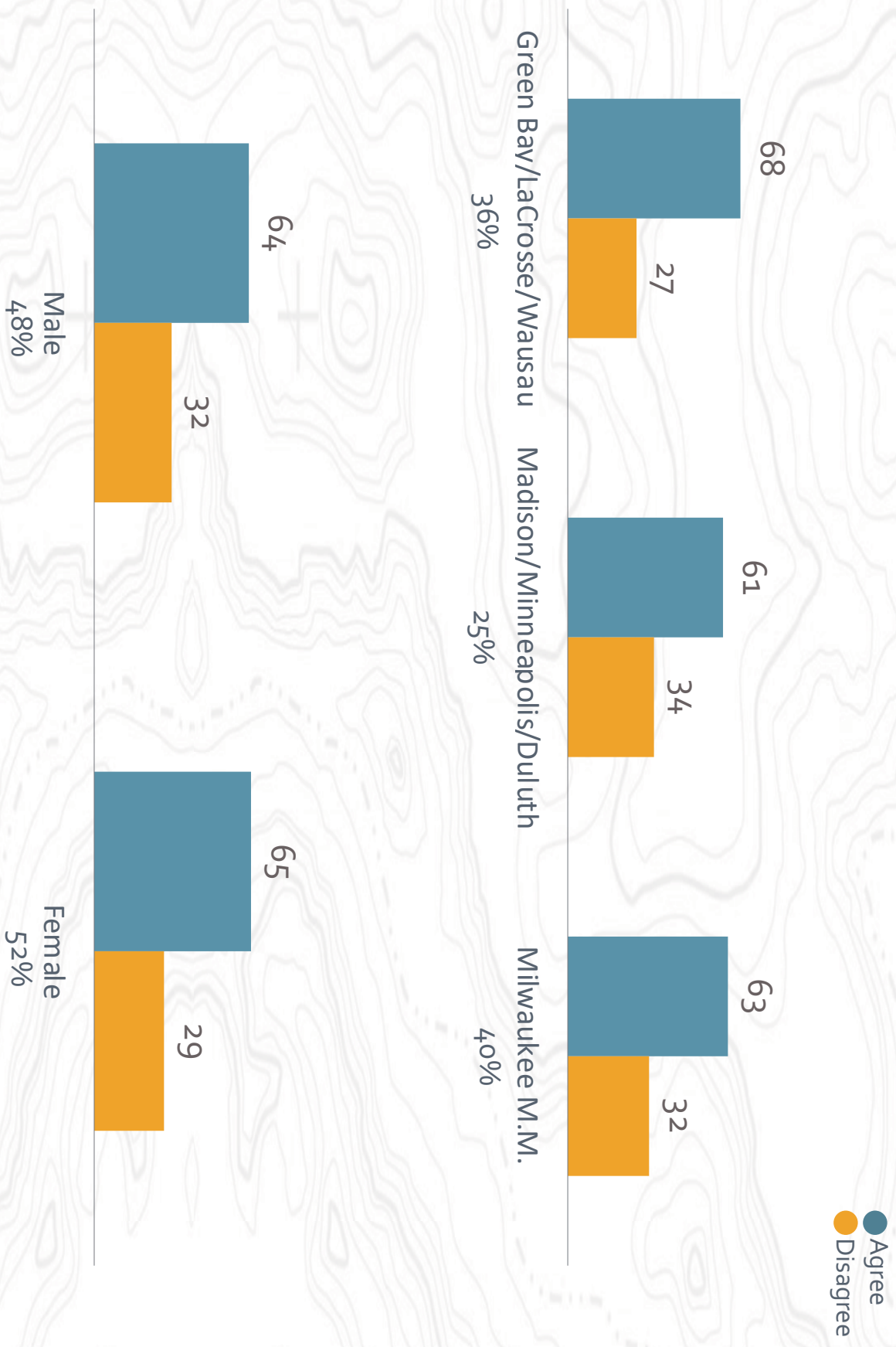


OPEN TRANSFER WINDOW

Current options for parents to transfer from one public district to another or to a private school are limited to certain time windows. Parents should be able to transfer schools at any time.

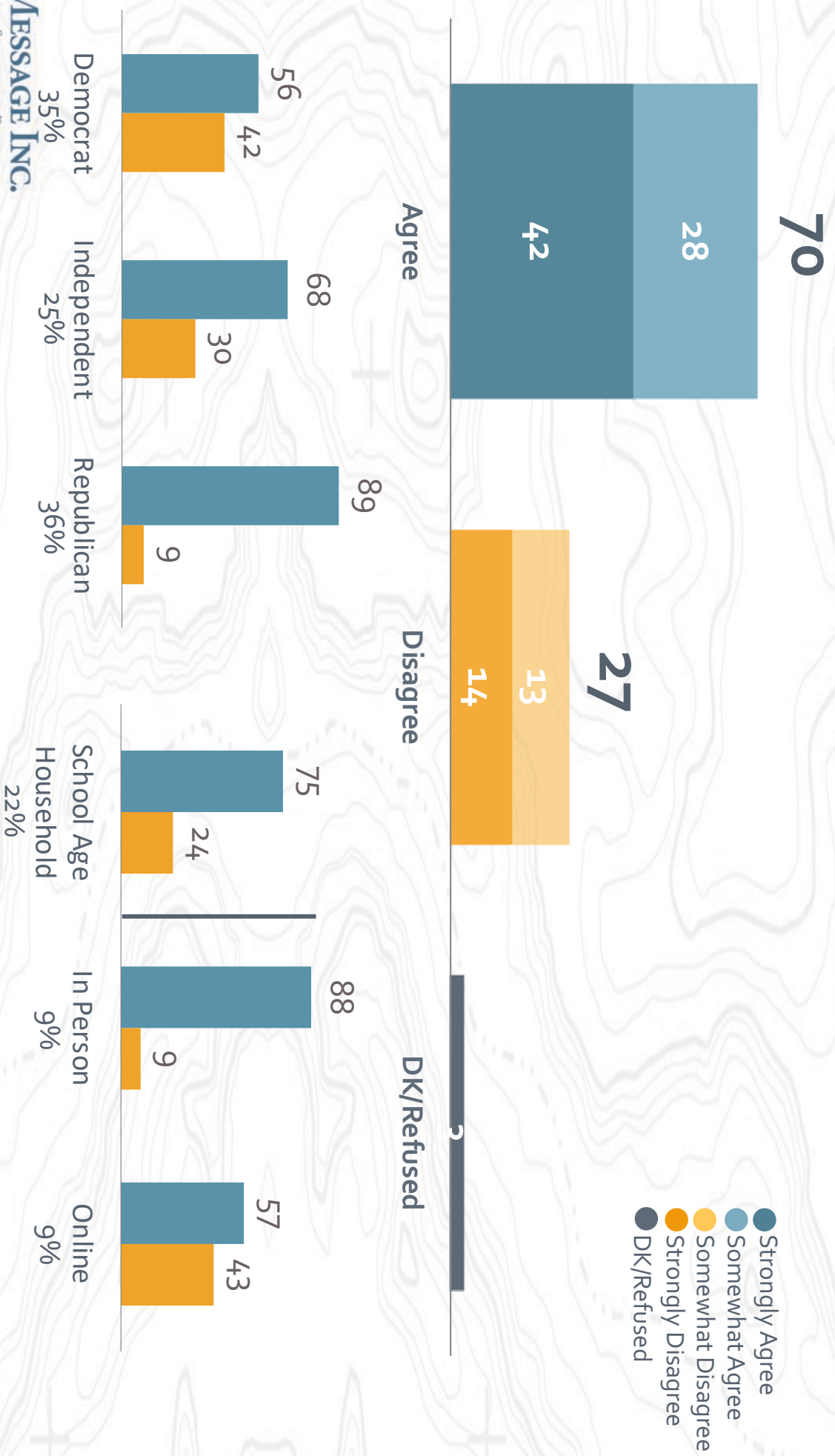

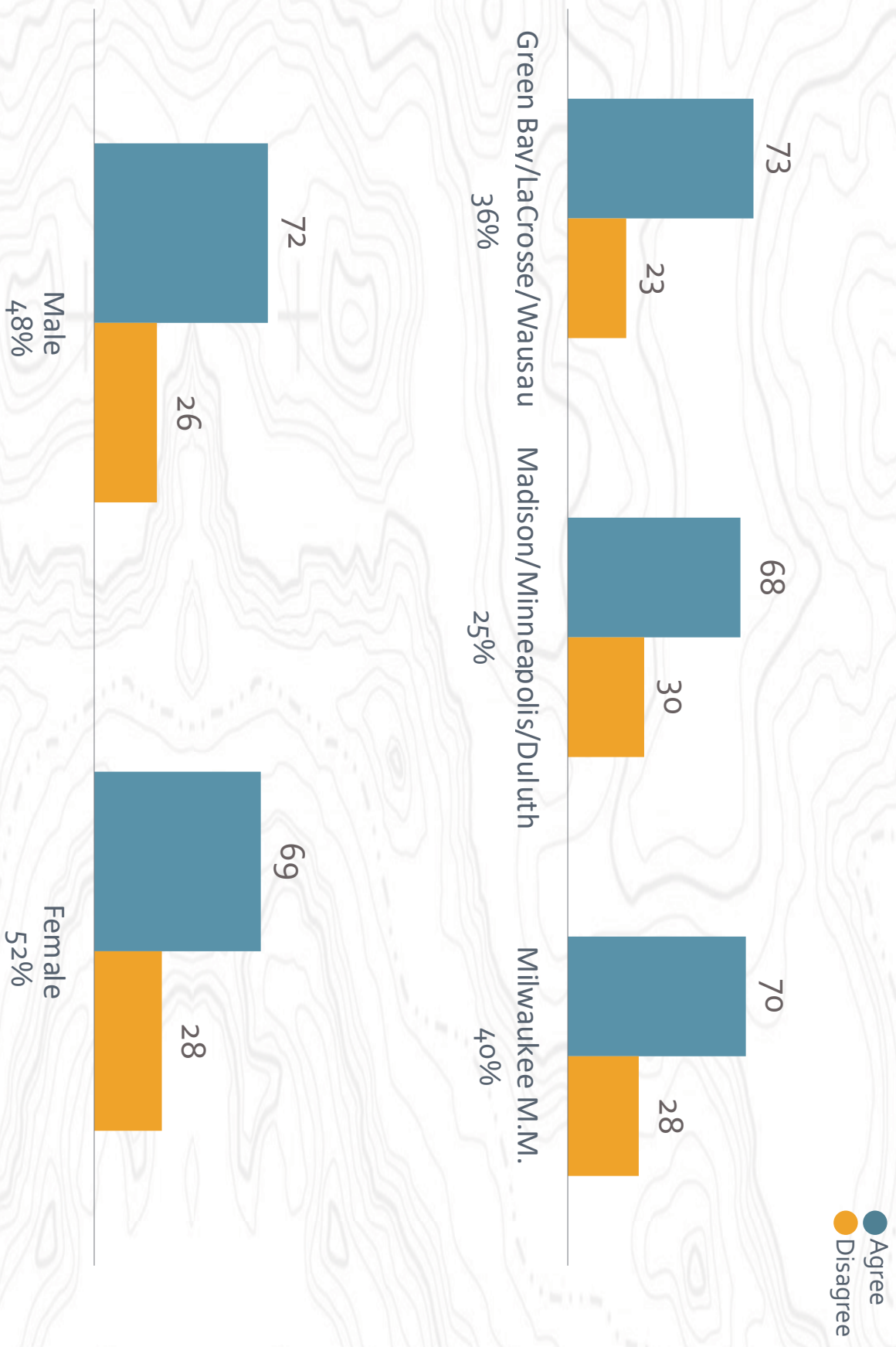


TRANSFER TO IN-PERSON

If a parent wants in-person education but the local district is only offering online education, the student should be allowed to transfer to a nearby district that is offering in-person education.

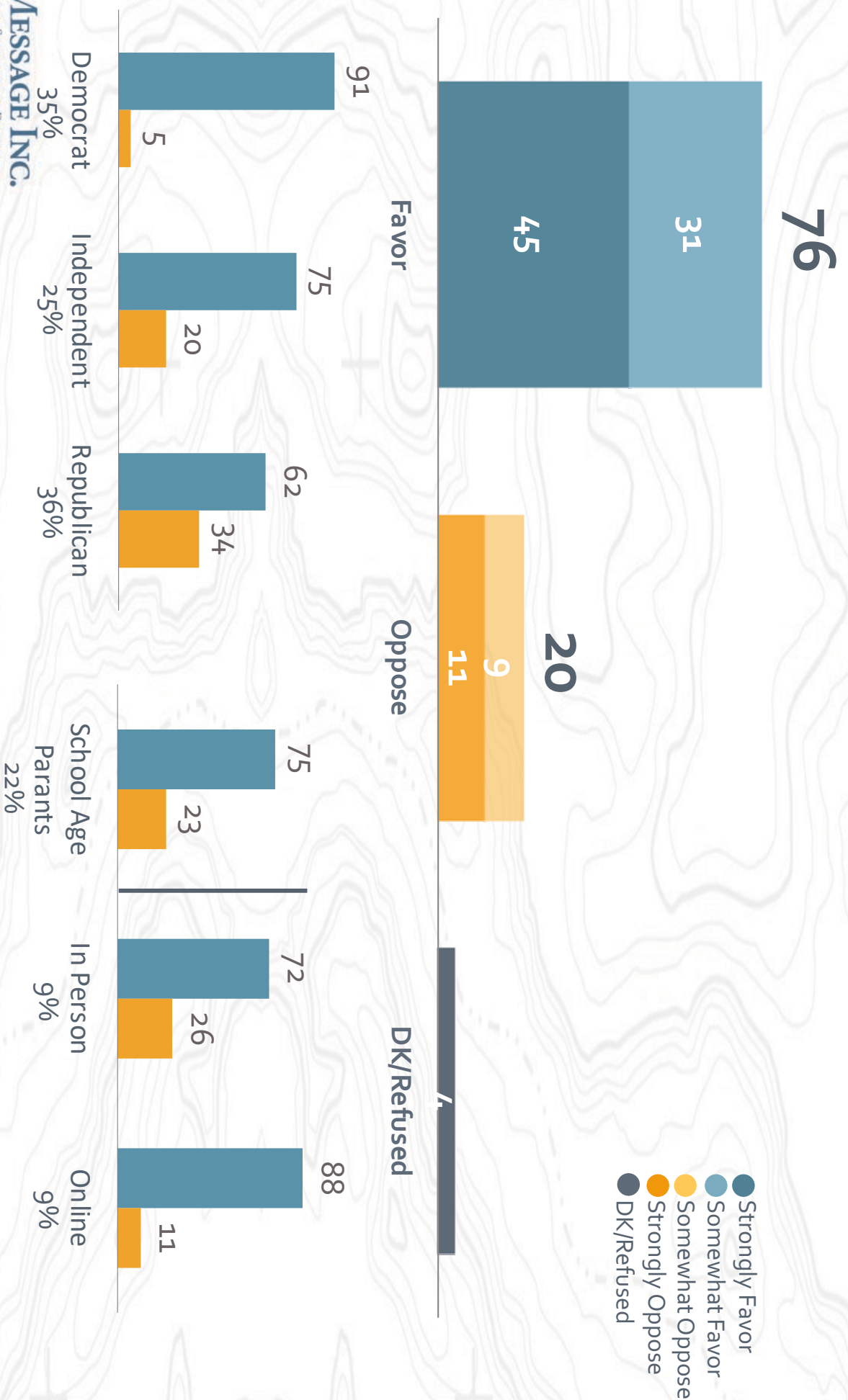

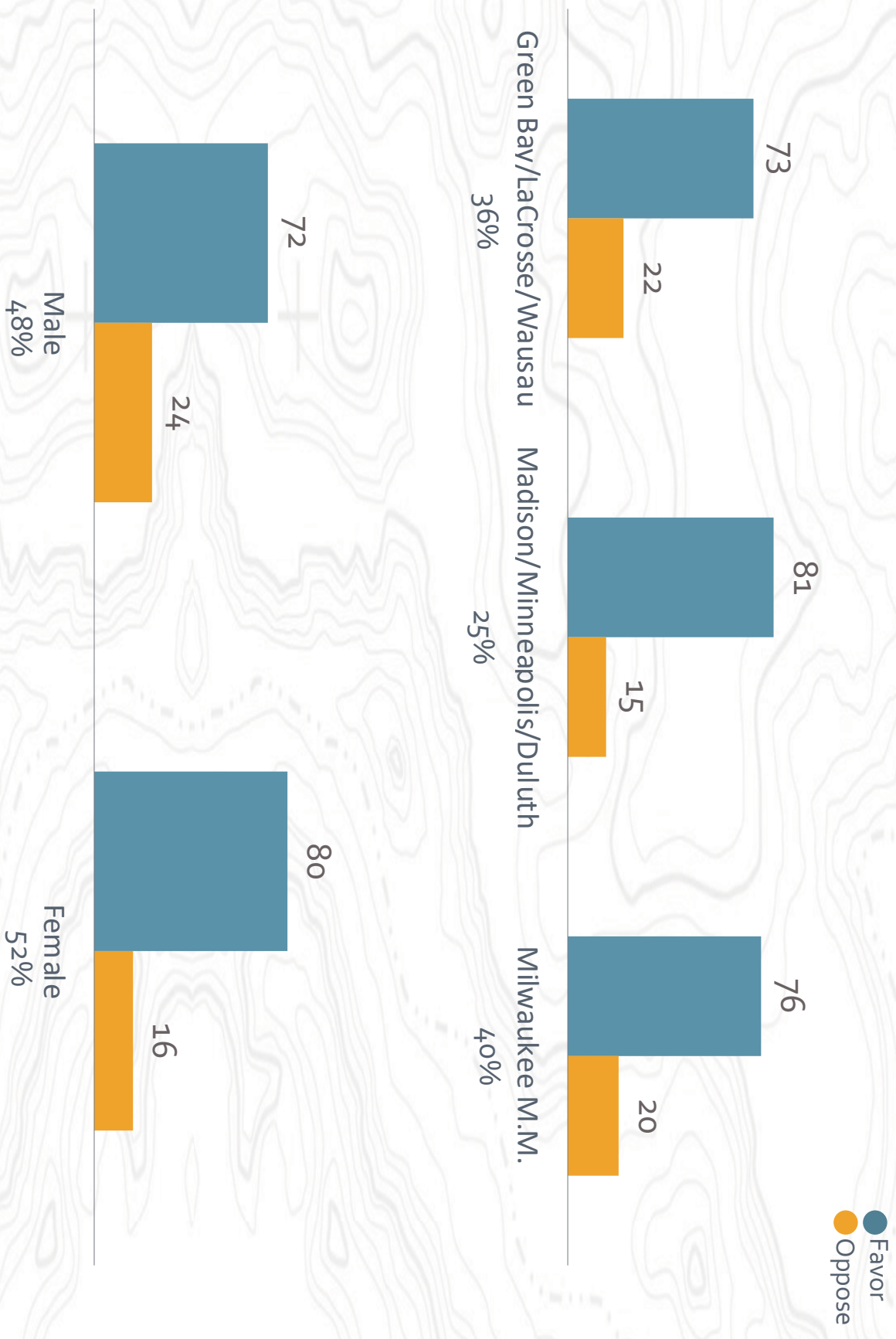


PURCHASING EQUIPMENT FOR ONLINE SCHOOL

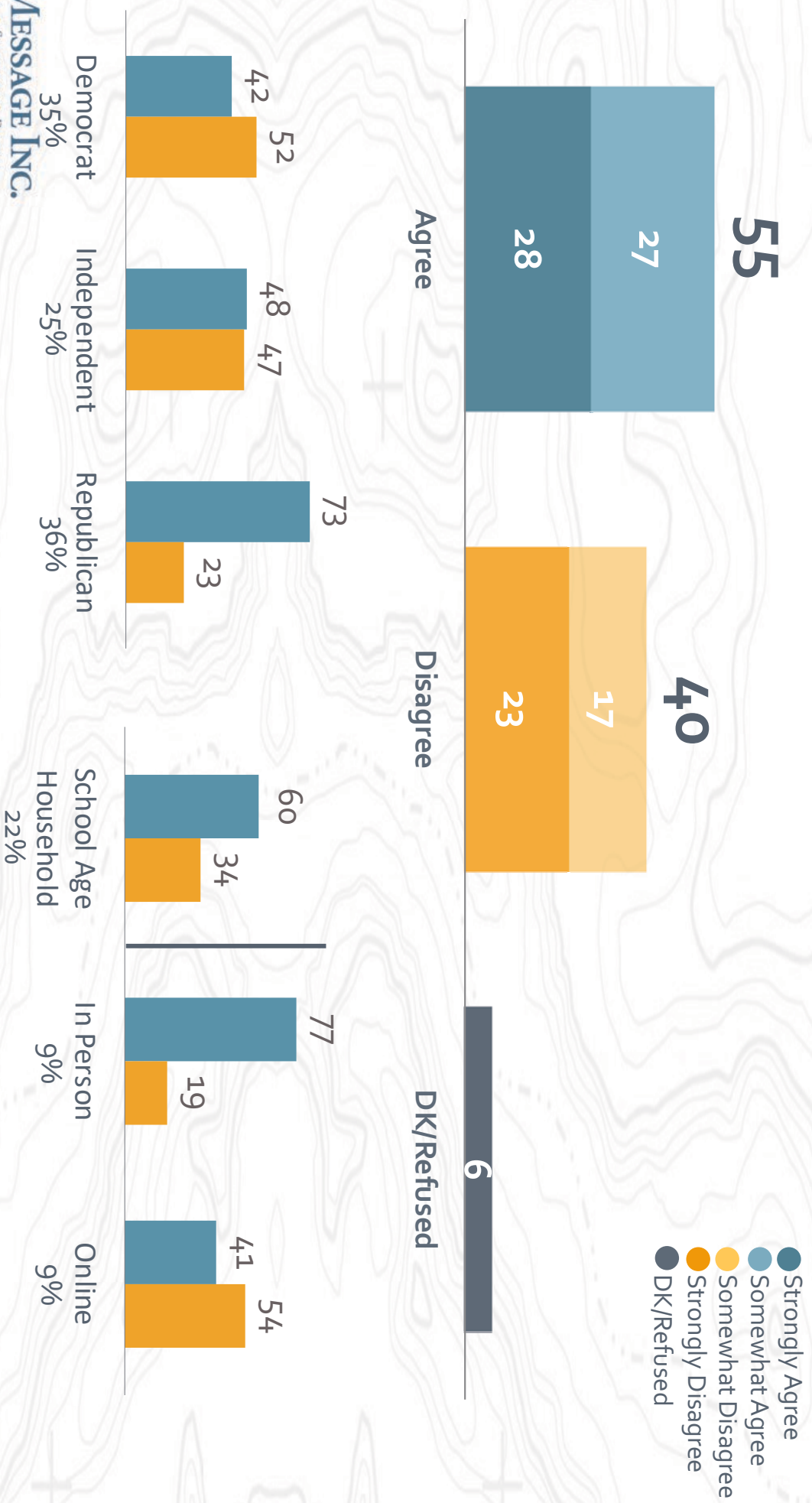
ADDITIONAL MATERIAL/TUTOR GRANTS

If parents want their children to stay in their district school but online programming isn't working well for their child, grant money for additional learning materials or tutoring should be available to them.



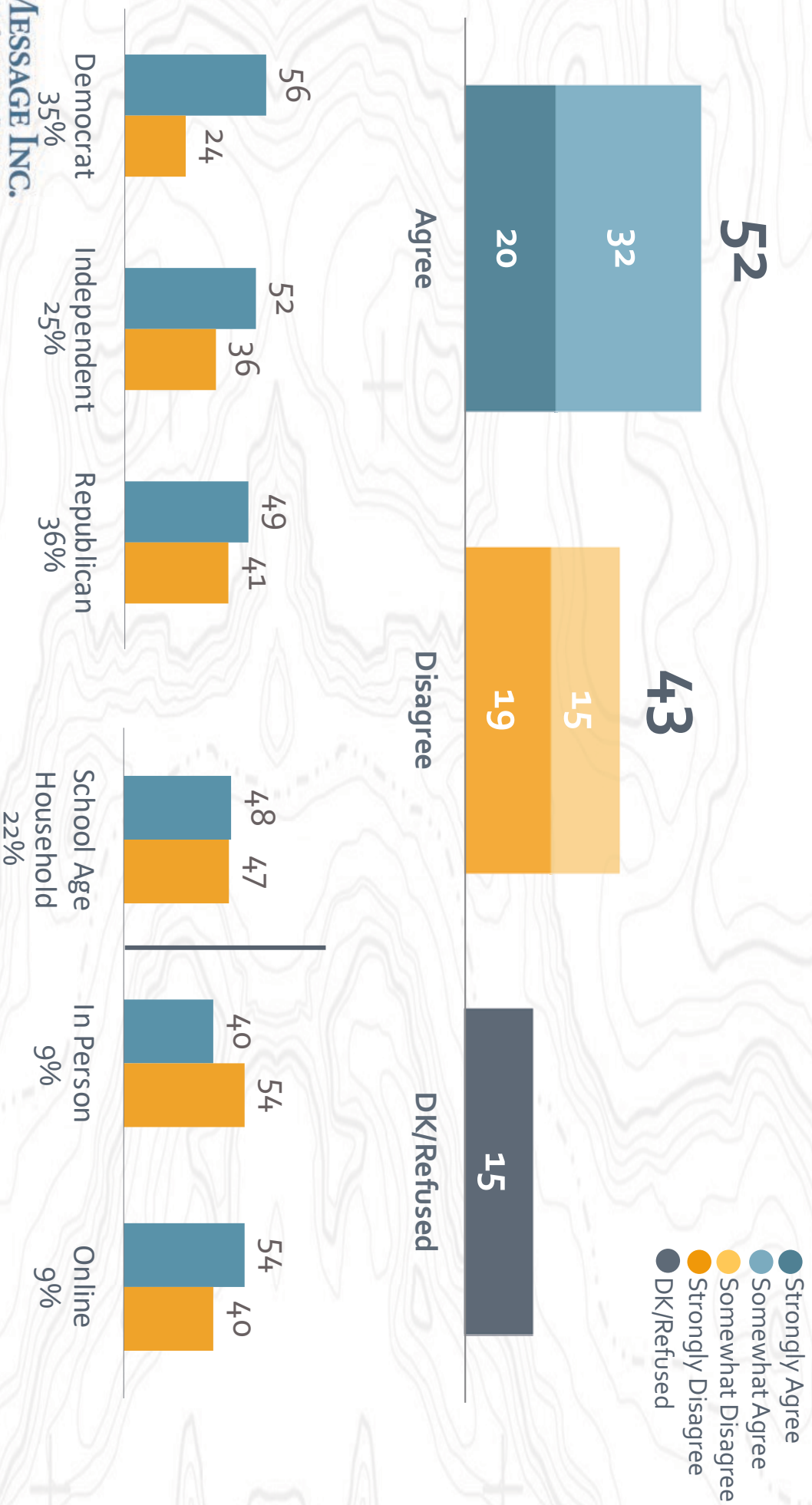
SPORTS TRANSFERS

If a school does not allow varsity sports due to COVID-19, but a neighboring district does, an athlete should be allowed to transfer without losing eligibility.



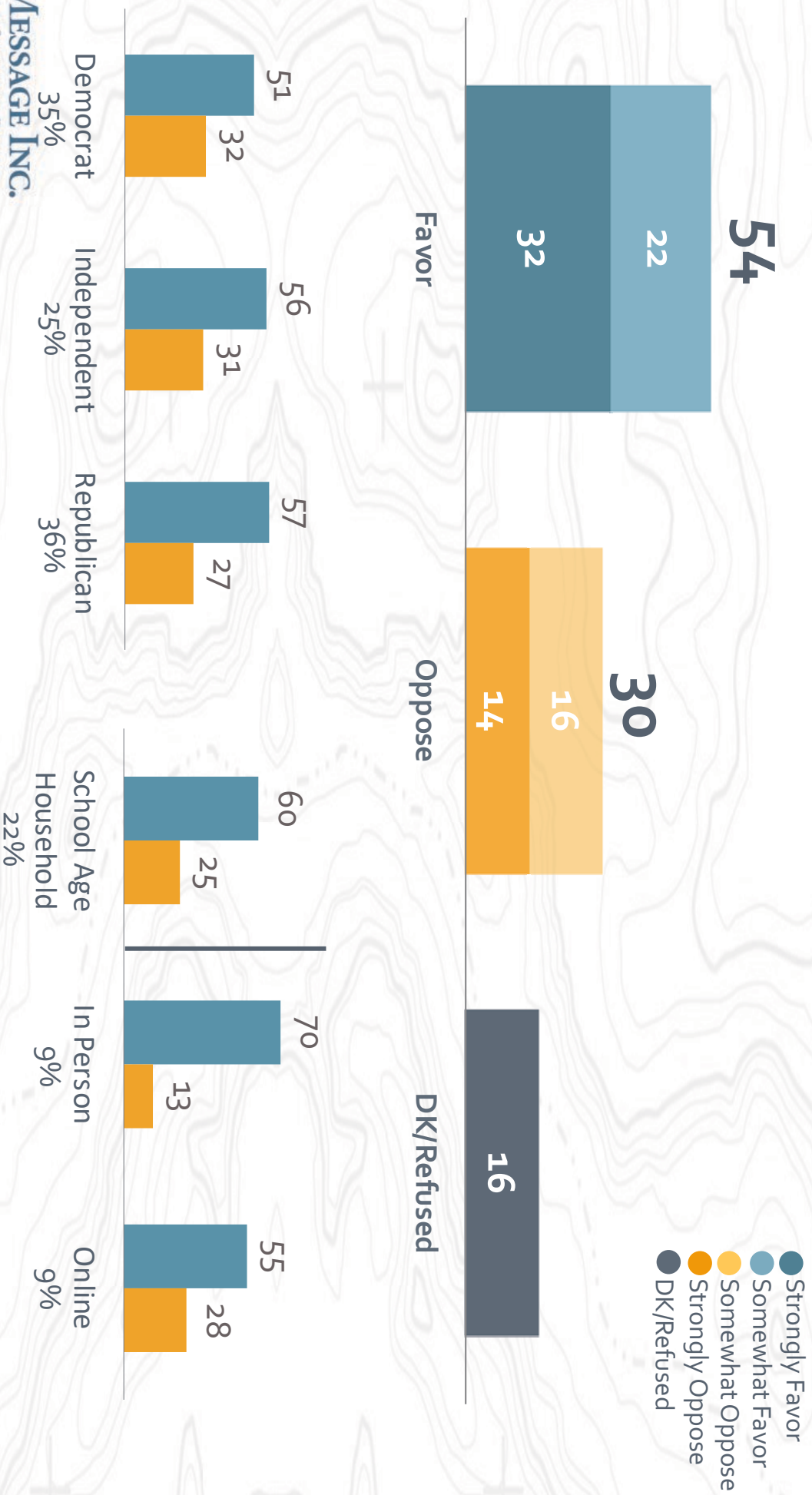
BLEND OF IN-HOME AND IN PERSON LEARNING

In future school years, I would be interested in a blend of in-person instruction at school, and at-home online learning.

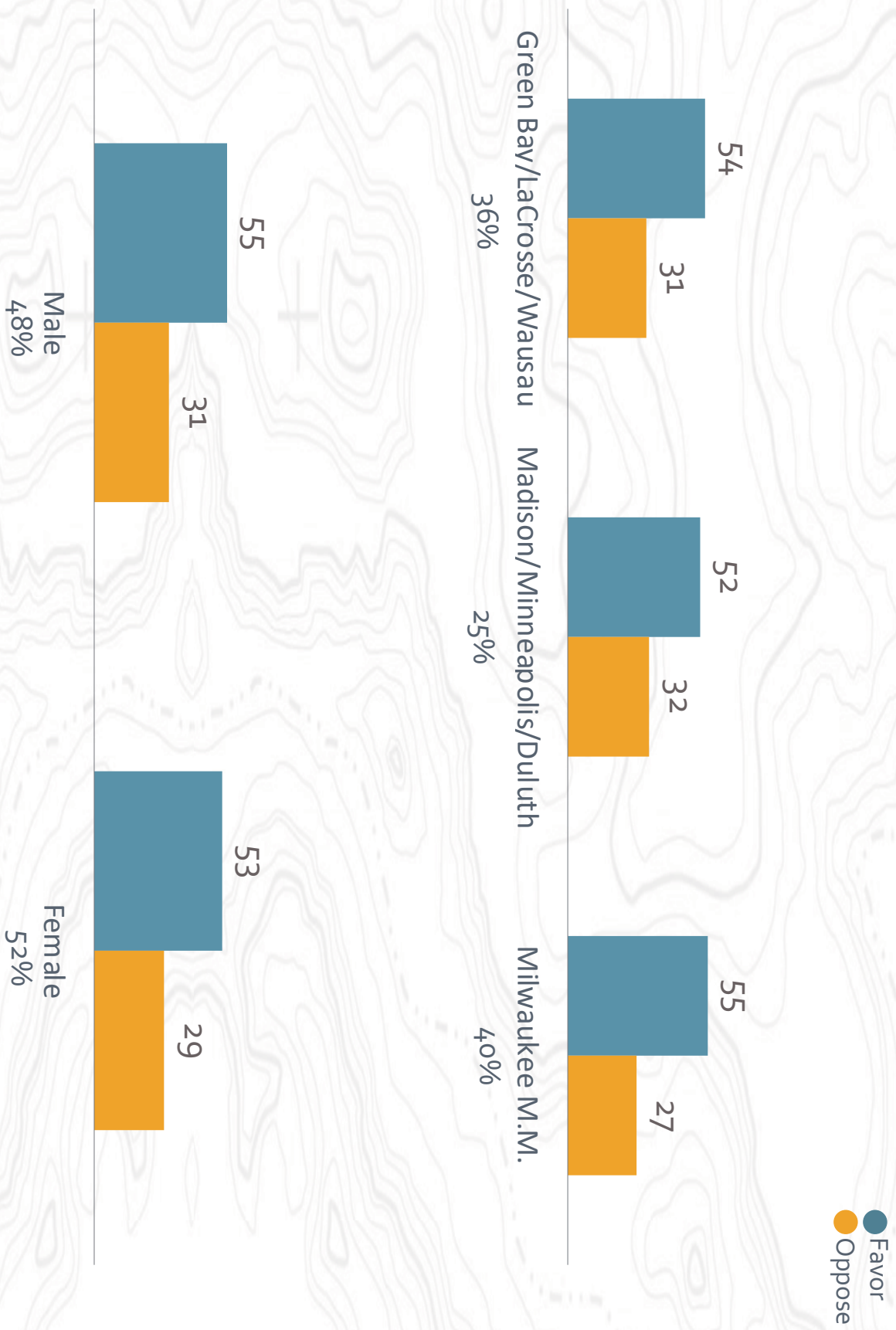


CHANGES TO THE 529 PLANS

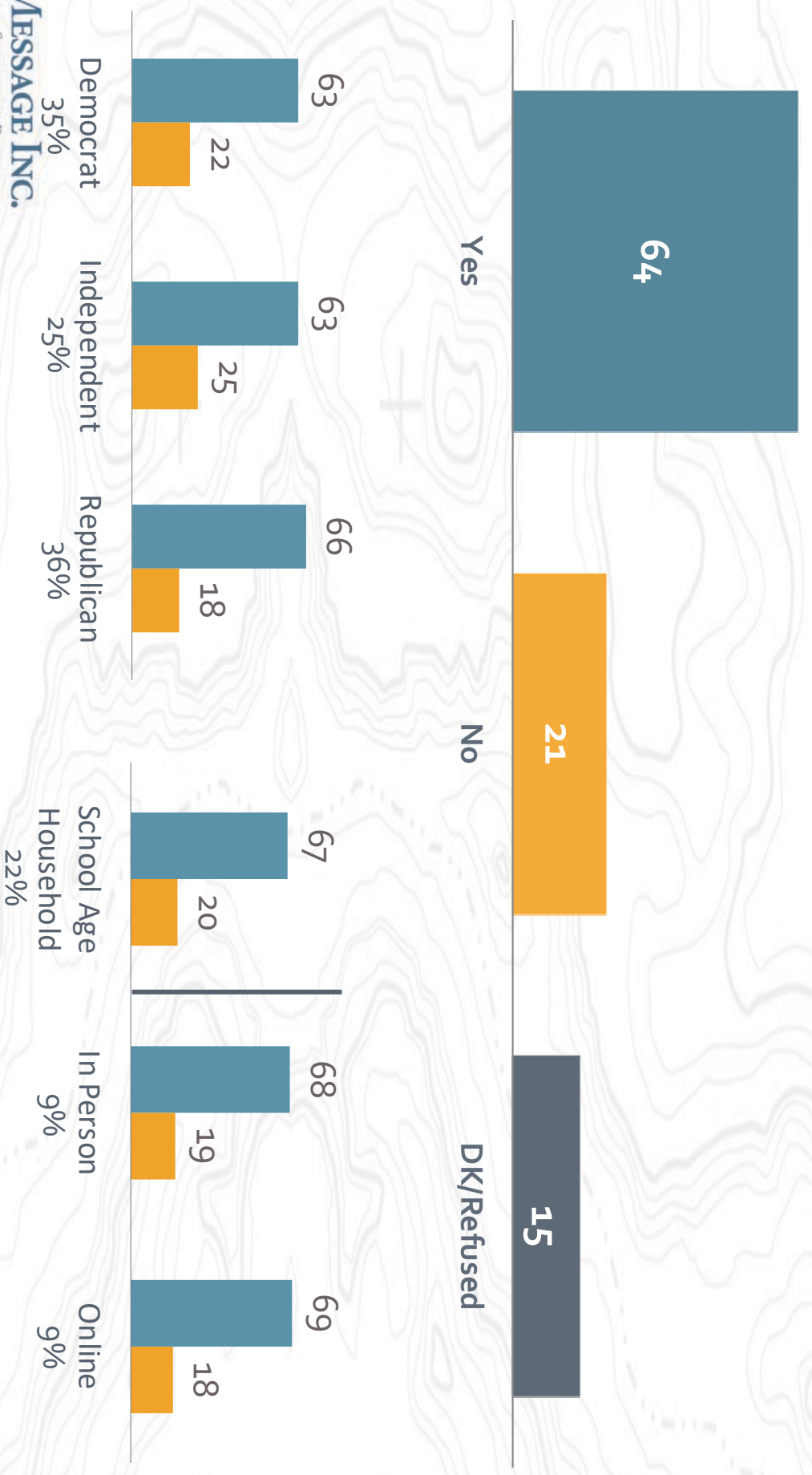

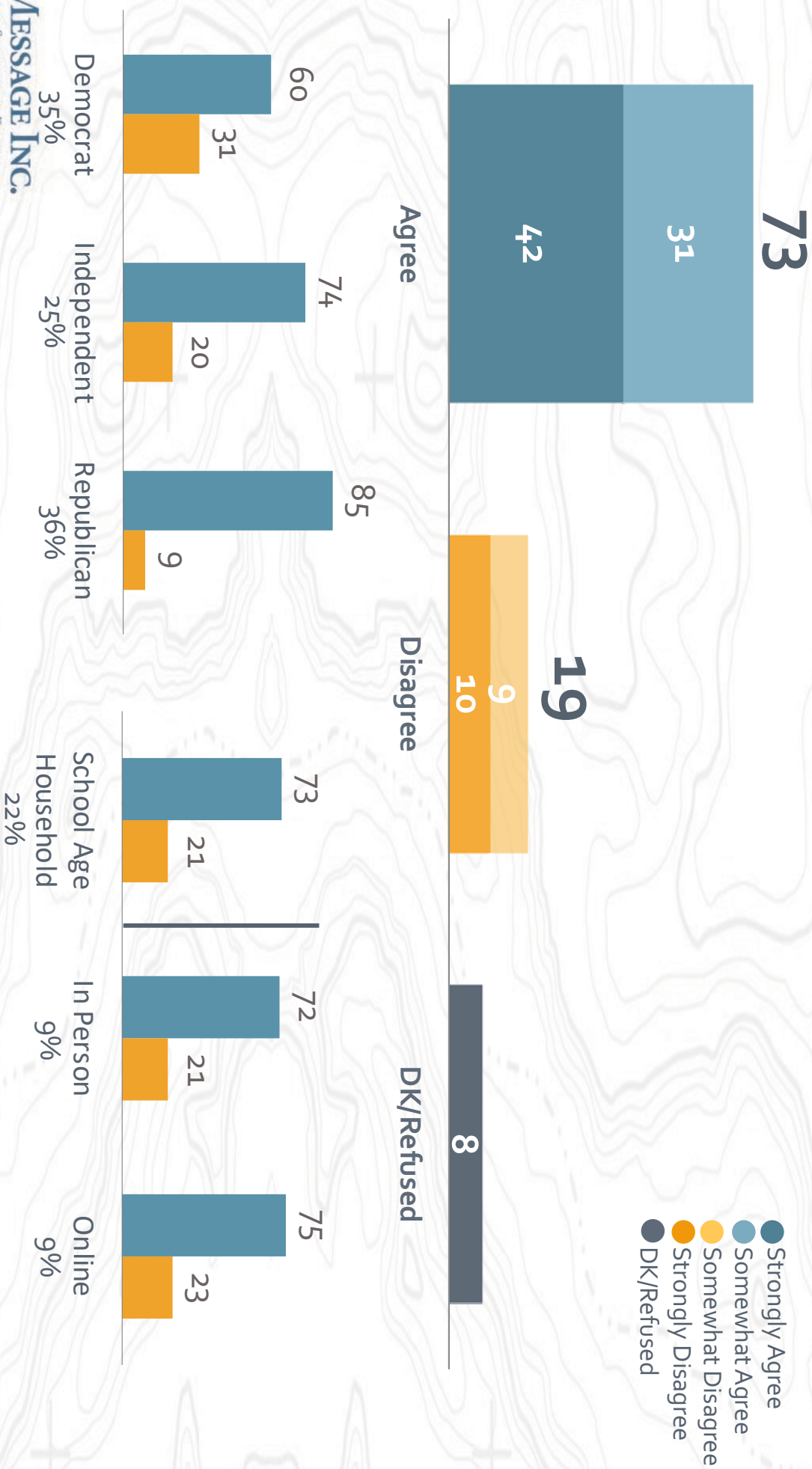
AVERAGE DAILY ATTENDANCE TRACKING

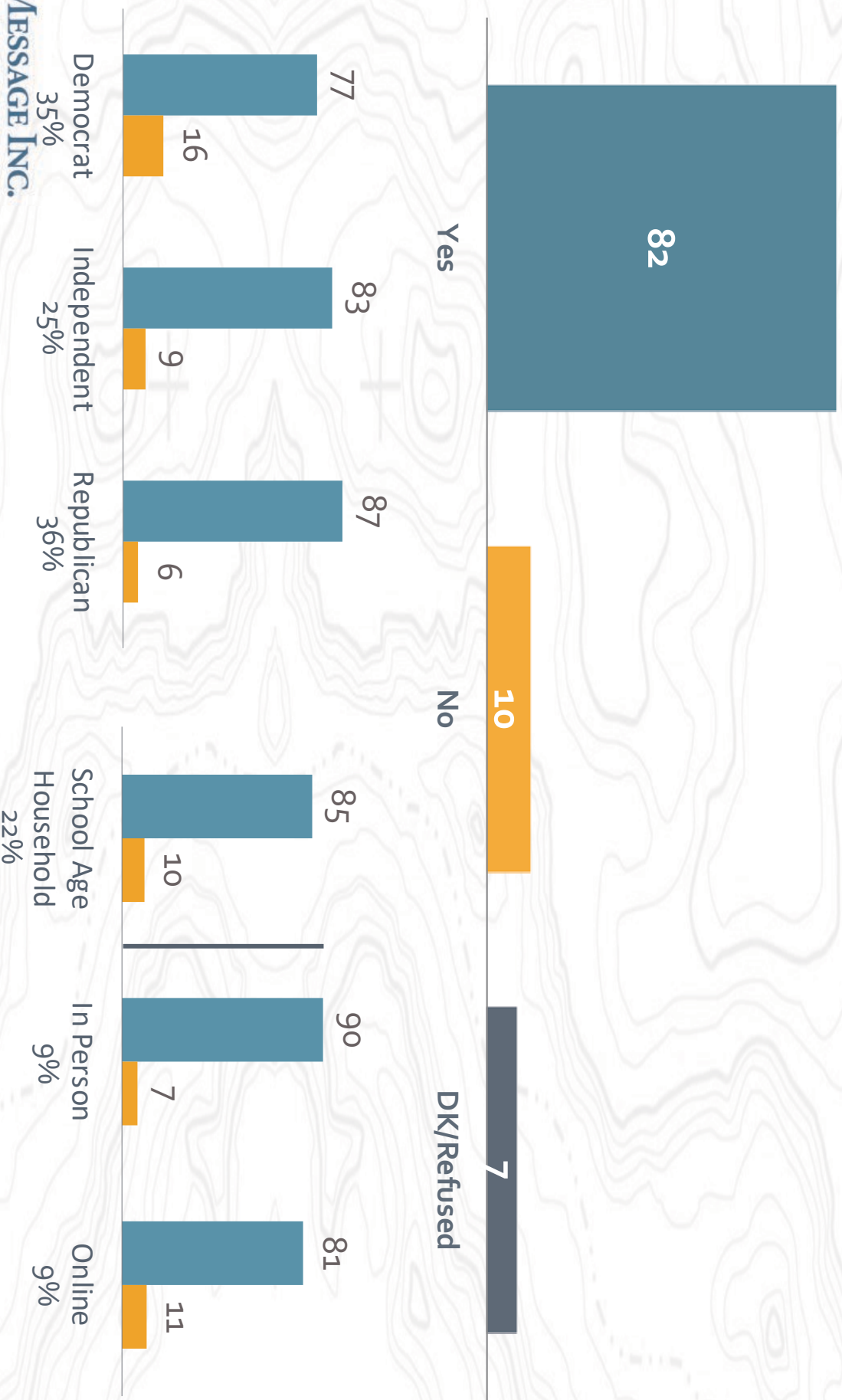
TESTING RESULTS TRANSPARENCY

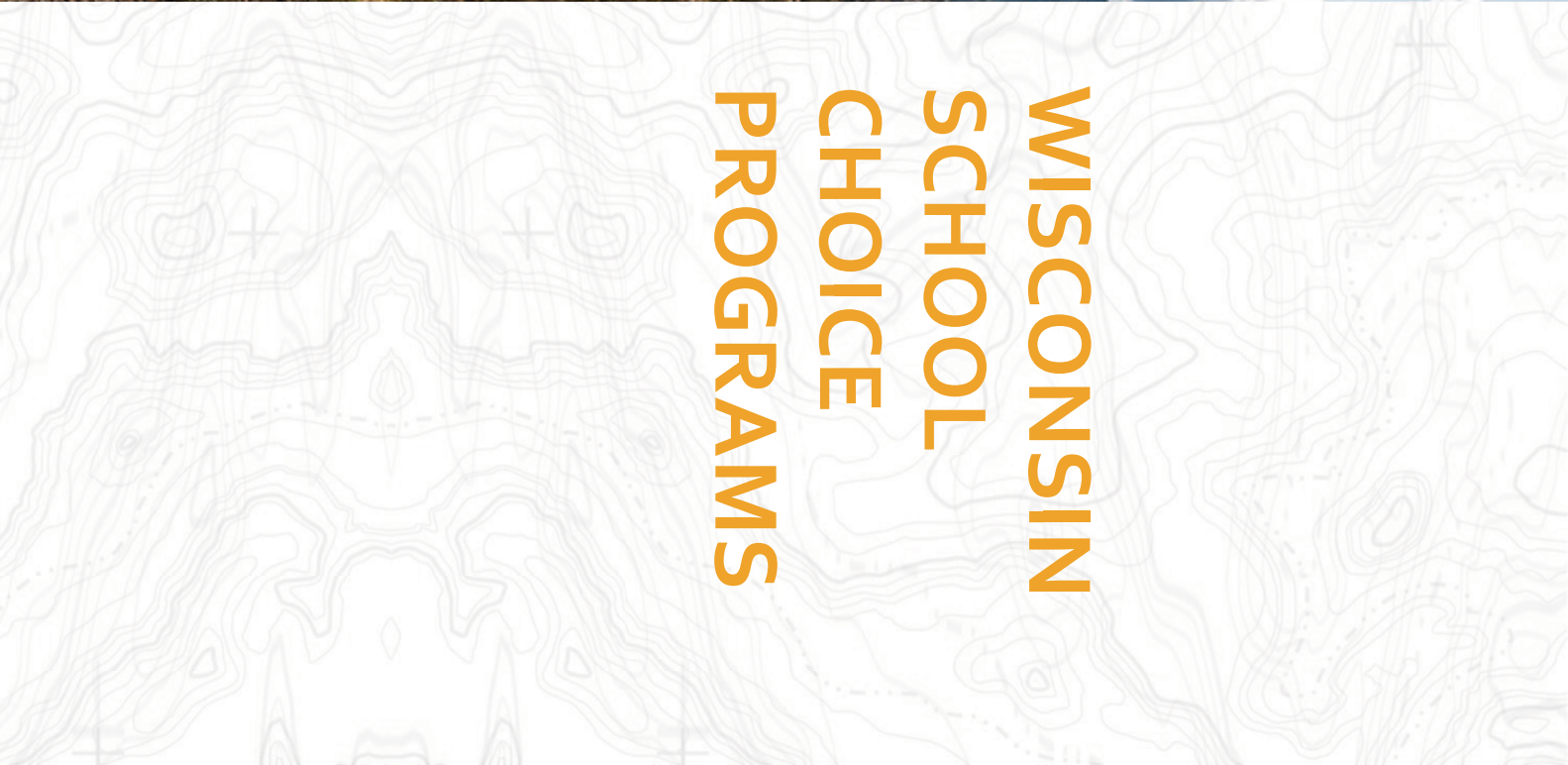
INDUSTRY CLASSES ENROLMENT AVAILABILITY

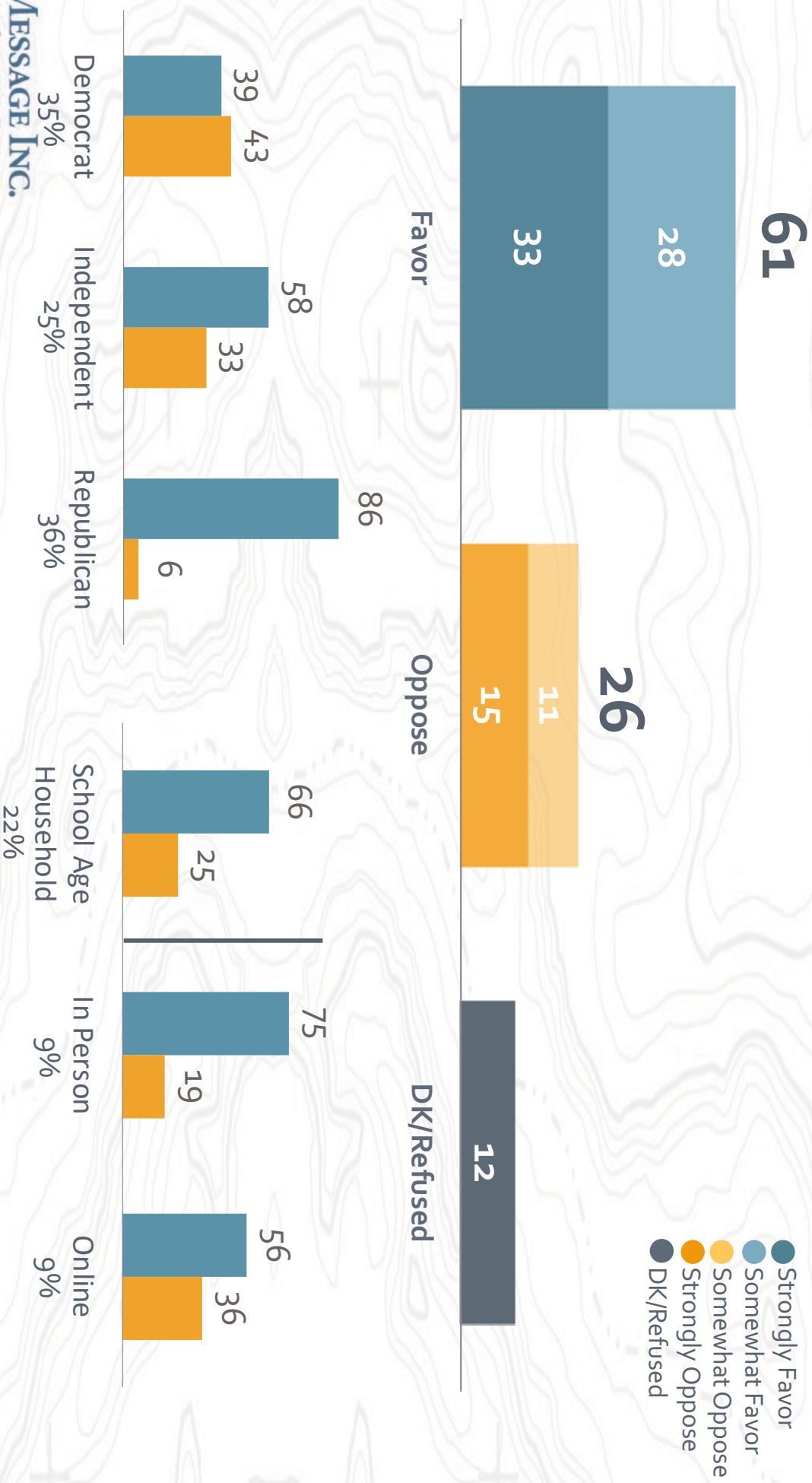

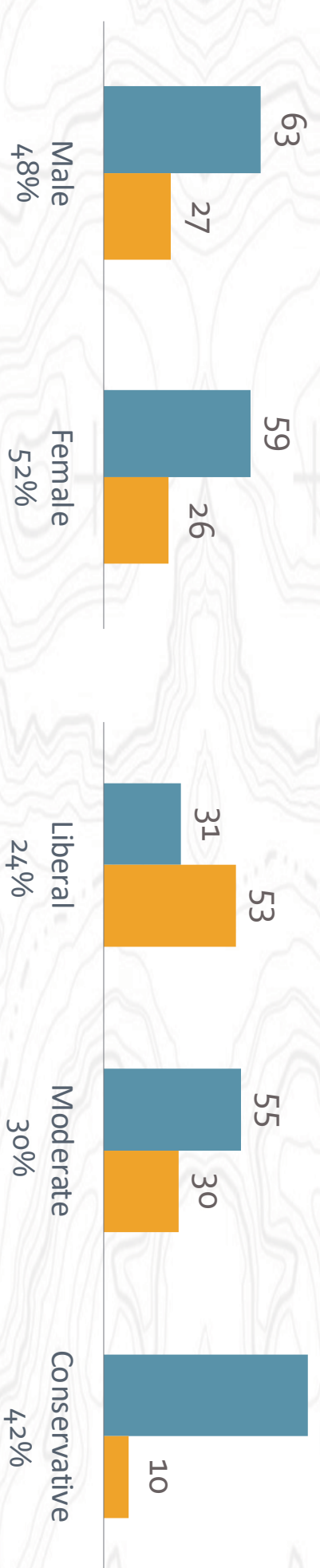
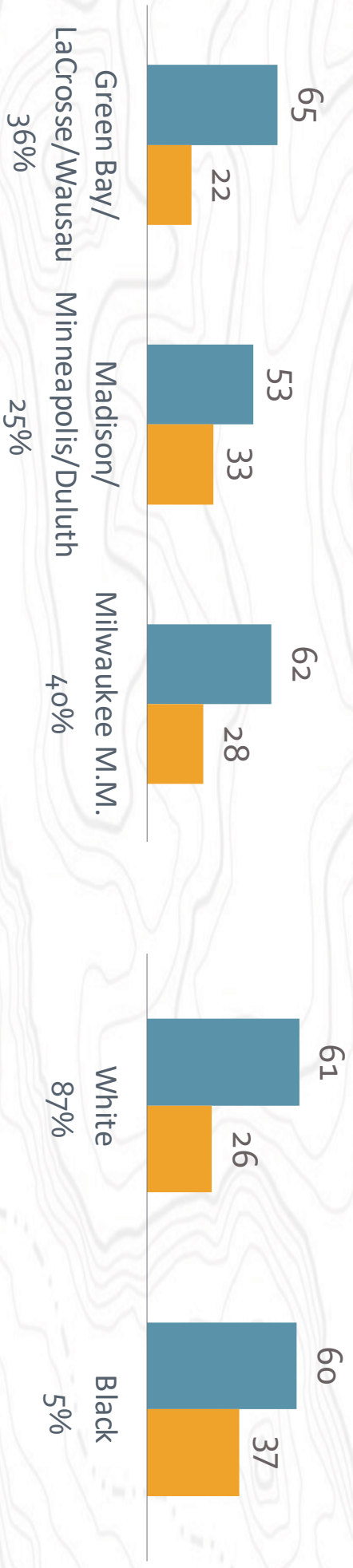
WISCONSIN'S SCHOOL CHOICE PROGRAM

Do you generally favor or oppose Wisconsin's School Choice program?



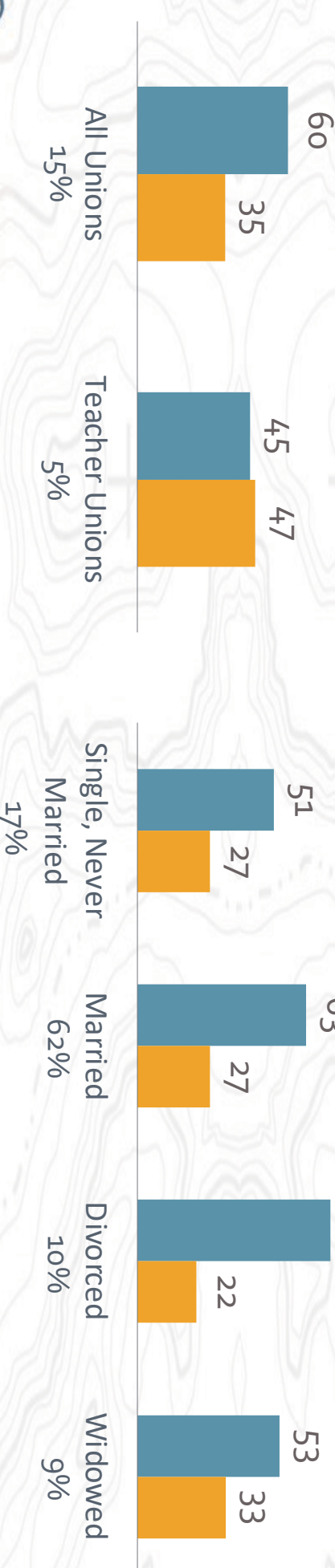
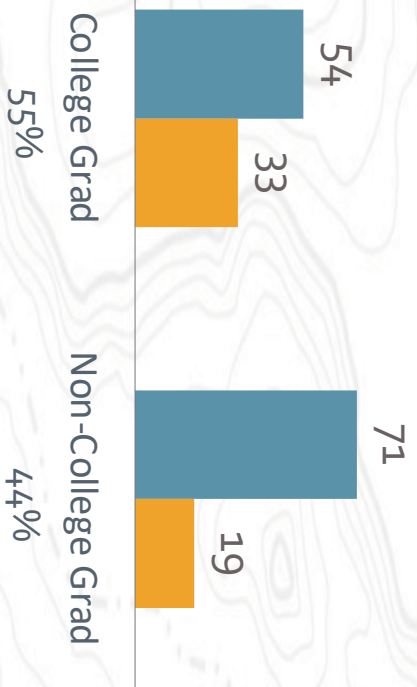
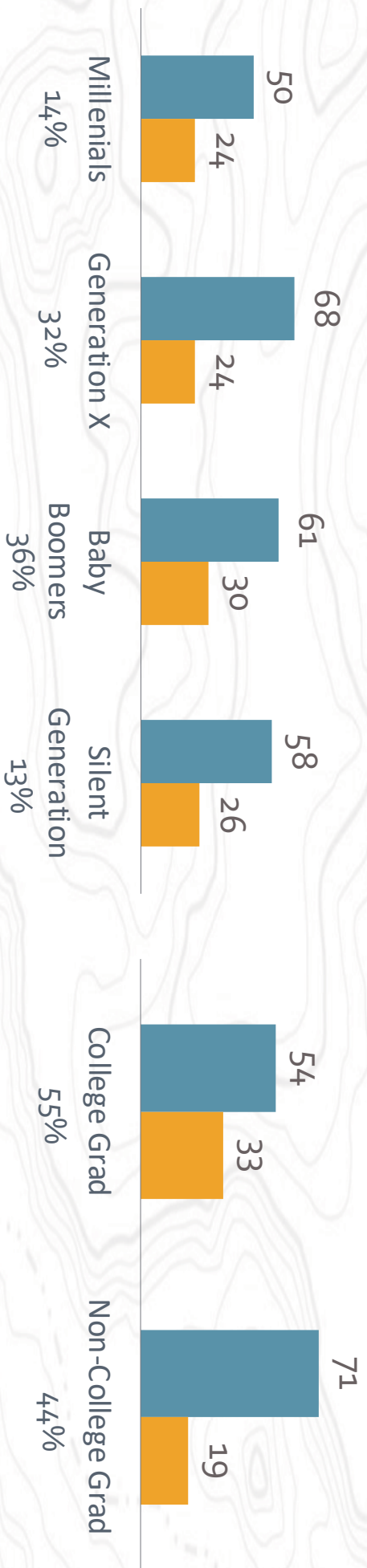

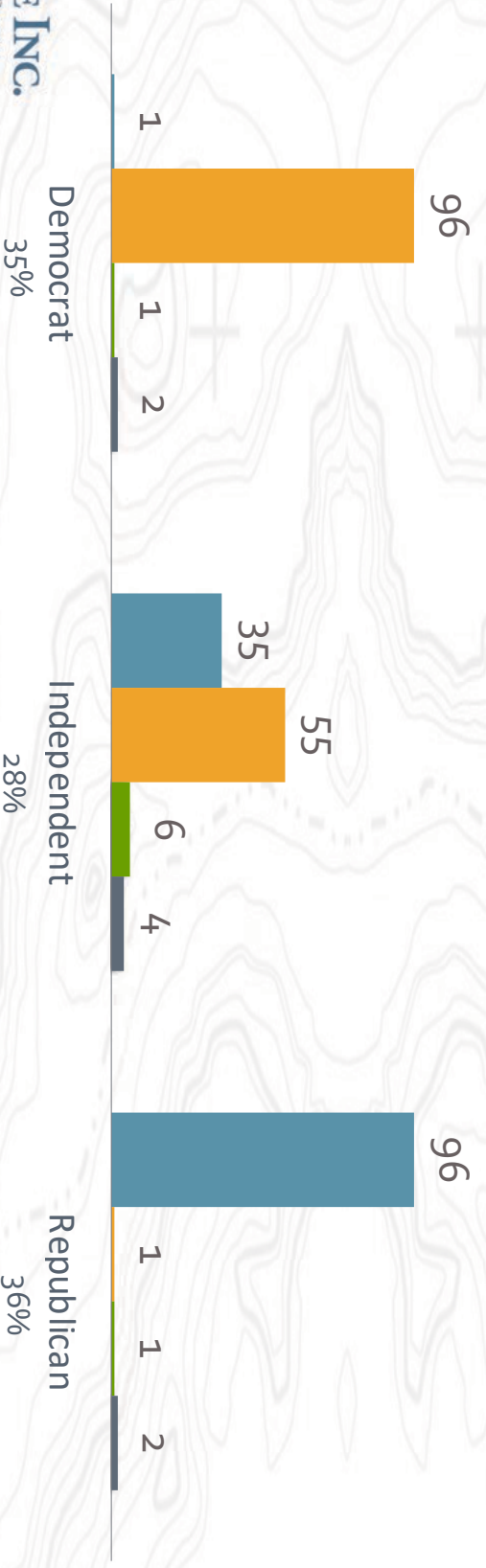

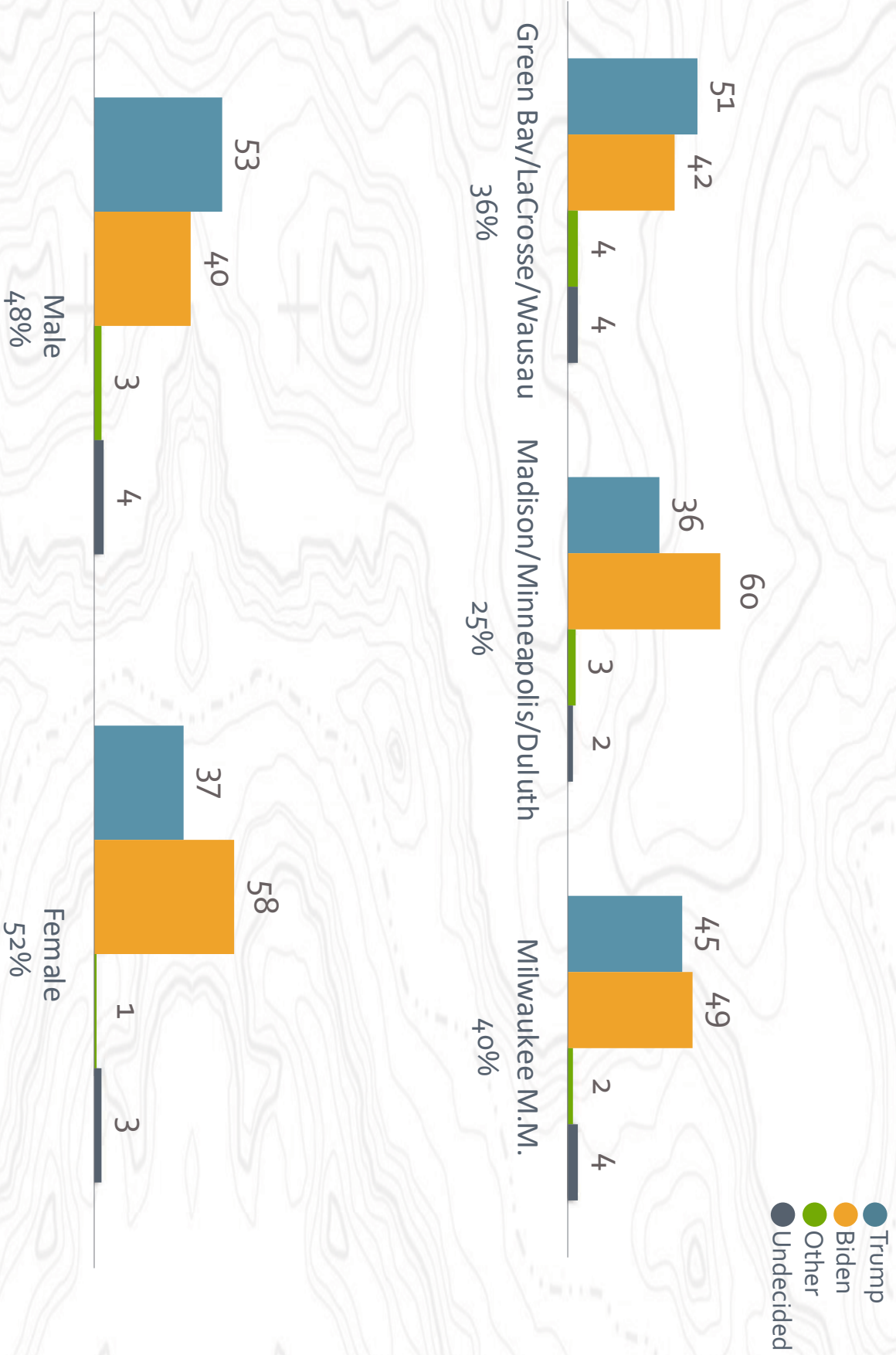
