Program eligibility is based on where the student lives and family income.

Student Residence

MPCP: City of Milwaukee **RPCP:** Racine Unified School District (RUSD) **WPCP:** Wisconsin, outside of Milwaukee and RUSD

SNSP: Wisconsin, no income eligibility required

Family Income

Family income must not exceed the income limits.
