#### SCWA KEY ISSUE OF THE MONTH:

## **AUTONOMY**

It is imperative that we advocate for schools' freedom in the areas of curriculum and instruction. Several bills have been proposed over the years that would undermine this independence by mandating state-regulated curriculum and instruction in private schools, and it has already started in the current session. More red tape and regulation means losing opportunities for innovation, which will also lead to fewer schools remaining in or joining the program. Loss of autonomy will make parental choice programs unsustainable.

The bottom line is that *choice is working*. Students in the Milwaukee, Racine, and statewide programs outperform their peers and score higher on the college-readiness ACT exam. Giving schools the freedom to develop their curriculum and teaching practices allows them to provide students with a top-notch education.

Several other states have included language in their choice programs aimed at preserving private school independence. SCWA plans to work with legal groups to develop language suitable for Wisconsin. We also continue to cautiously examine legislation to ensure choice schools' independence.



### NATIONAL SCHOOL CHOICE WEEK AT THE CAPITOL: RECAP

We celebrated National School Choice Week last month with two special events hosted at the Wisconsin State Capitol. First, **Dr. Patrick Wolf** (University of Arkansas) delivered an informative presentation to legislators on evidence-based benefits of school choice programs.



Second, hundreds of Wisconsin families gathered at a rally in the Capitol's rotunda to hear inspiring speeches from school leaders, legislators, and a student from Trinity Lutheran Freistadt in Mequon. Student groups from two Milwaukee schools, St. Anthony School and Eastbrook Academy, delivered engaging musical performances.
